Founded in 1973, Newcomers & Friends of Georgetown offers a personal invitation to you! We strive to create warm connections to anyone living in the Central Texas/Georgetown area.

As a way of promoting new friendships and sustaining existing ones, Newcomers & Friends is home to about 40 special interest groups. These range from physical fitness to games to dining out.

Newcomers & Friends now has over 200 members. Approximately half of our group's membership lives in Sun City. Members have moved to the Georgetown area from all parts of the United States and beyond. Meets the 1st Tuesday from 9:30-12:30 year round. Members take turns hostessing in their homes. Pennies from Heaven is a version of Canasta that is played with four players of two partnerships using 5 decks of cards. Looking for subs

#### The Grape Escape

Meets the 2nd Wednesday of October, December, February, and April in the afternoon/ evening. The next is February 8th.

They are a couples wine tasting group. Couples take turns hosting in their homes. The hosts select and provide the wine. Each couple brings an appetizer or dessert to share.

Additional Information: We ask that the wines selected for tasting (usually 2 whites and 2 reds) cost \$20 or less and be locally available. The idea is to introduce new, inexpensive wines to each other. While not required, it is not at all unusual for the host couple to provide a more substantial food item such as a brisket, tamales, sandwiches, etc. so people are not drinking on an empty stomach. We limit our membership to 7 couples which means each couple hosts once every 2 years. We do not meet as an official group from May through September though individual couples volunteer to host the group for unofficial gatherings during these off-months. These optional gatherings are BYOW along with an appetizer or dessert to share. We allow guests to attend our tastings BUT before bringing a guest we ask that permission be obtained from the hosting couple.






