

What is sotol, anyway?

Sotol is a distilled spirit made from the sotol plant native to the Chihuahuan Desert, which spans West Texas, northern Mexico and southern portions of New Mexico and Arizona. The spiny desert shrub, also known as desert spoon, grows wild and weed-like. It is part of the asparagus family and a distant cousin to agave, which is the source of mezcals, including tequila. Sotol plants resemble sea-urchins and have a tall stalk with a white or yellow flower shooting from the center during the summer months.





MATADOOR

- 50mL Bottle of Desert Door Original Texas Sotol
 - 6 oz Can Dole Pineapple JuiceLime Wedge or Juice
- Chili Lime Salt (Optional, For Rim)

Before cracking open the can, rub lime wedge around the rim. Dip can rim in chili lime salt. Open can and take a big sip of pineapple juice. Squeeze lime and pour in the Desert Door.



 Desert Door Distillery's Texas Sotol is sold in blue ceramic bottles that were custom-made in Mexico. The brand was founded in Driftwood, Texas, by three military veterans and natives of the state.

Desert Door Distillery



- 2 oz Desert Door Oak-Aged or Original Texas Sotol
- 1 Teaspoon Maple Syrup (0.25 oz) - 2 Dashes Angostura Bitters
 - Orange Peel

Stir syrup, bitters, and sotol in your cup. Using your pocket knife, peel an orange over cocktail and place on top.

Founded in 1973, Newcomers & Friends of Georgetown offers a personal invitation to you! We strive to create warm connections to anyone living in the Central Texas/Georgetown area.

As a way of promoting new friendships and sustaining existing ones, Newcomers & Friends is home to about 40 special interest groups. These range from physical fitness to games to dining out.

Newcomers & Friends now has 245 members, and 69 of these are new. Approximately half of our group's membership lives in Sun City. Members have moved to the Georgetown area from all parts of the United States and beyond. Members do not have to have recently moved to Georgetown - many of our more recent members discovered our group after living in the Georgetown area for many years!

Newcomers & Friends meets the first Thursday of each month (September through May). Each month's meeting features a program. Instead of receiving an honorarium, guest speakers choose a charity or non-profit to receive a monetary donation.
